

Menu and Recipe

Using the same rough style as the Taco Soup project, I would like you to create a poster using one of the following two options.

1. **A pirate themed menu and recipe:** Mr. Larson is the captain of the pirate ship “Eclipse” and you are his head chef. Create a menu for a fancy meal you would serve to him and some of his pirate friends. Your budget is 5 pieces of gold. Although pirate ships did not have a fridge, freezer, or fancy ingredients, you may pretend we have those things. Tigger and Jean may want something to eat as well. You may add one item for them in a separate area if space allows. I will read them what you plan on serving them, and they will meow if they like it. Mr. Larson hates broccoli, cauliflower, raw tomatoes, olives, beets, tuna casserole, asparagus, cucumbers, Dr. Pepper, mustard, pickles, raw oysters, pumpkin, and a few other things. If any of these things are on the menu, you will walk the plank, and a new chef will be hired to take your place!



2. **A Holiday themed menu and recipe:** You are going to pretend you are inviting one of your teachers to a holiday party at your house and you need to create a menu to convince them to attend. You may choose from one of the holidays suggested on the “Pirate or Holiday Store” project we did.

Things that it must include (and in the following order):

- A title that contains the name of the pirate ship such as “The Jolley Roger” (make up a good one) or something like “Larson Christmas Dinner” if you picked the holiday themed version.
- A brief paragraph inviting the person to dinner on whatever day you choose.
- It will need heading that says “Proposed Meal” or something like.
- A photo of the main food item you are serving (see the list below for more information).
- A list of the following things you plan on serving: **a drink, an appetizer, a salad, two side dishes, a main item, and a dessert item.**
- Be descriptive of your foods, use “**Garlic Roasted Chicken**” instead, it sounds better than just “Chicken.” Perhaps use an adjective in front of every food such as “Fiery Roasted Peppers”! You can use the internet to for food adjectives if you would like.
- A clipart of at least one of the other foods under the list of foods.
- Put the ingredients list for at least one of the foods under the clipart. The heading should tell me what food it is for. You may use the internet to find a list of ingredients for this food.
- If you have room, in paragraph format, put the directions you would follow to make the food. If you do not have room you may skip this step.
- Put some sort of descriptive sentence, such as “A pirate’s life for me” or “Our house is your house” on a line by itself (make up a better one than mine) and then include your name under that.



How to make it look nice:

- Must fit on the front side of your paper and also use “No Spacing.”
- A page color or texture as the background.
- Your own choice of border, margins, fonts, sizes, and colors.
- Symbols where you feel they would look the best.
- Anything else you want to do to make it look nice
